Chairman's Report

Chairman's Spring Report

Village tidy:

Heavy Goods Vehicle Problems:

The Parish Council carried out a heavy goods vehicle traffic survey' many thanks to Councillor Carey for his sterling work on this project. From this survey we contacted many of the transport companies whose vehicles were travelling through Old Stratford. To date we have had three responses and they all say that if residents see any heavy goods vehicle passing through Old Stratford at speed they should take a note of the vehicle number and the name of the transport company and report that information to the Parish Clerk. Once again I like to say a big thank you to Councillor Carey.

Street Lighting

Street lighting, or lack of, in Towcester and London Road appears to make the area very dark, the Parish Council, initially, were informed, by the County Council, that those street lights that were on, would be replaced with new ones and those that were switched off would be removed and at the time the Parish Council requested that two lights on the right hand side of Towcester and London road to be switched back on, at which point they were. However, the Parish Council was not informed and/or consulted when the County Council and their Contractor's Belfour Beatty removed all the street lights on the right hand side of Towcester and London Road, subsequent the Parish Council asked the County Council for a meeting to discuss this issue, a meeting was held and from the discussions which took place, it was evident that the lights on the right hand side of the Towcester and London road would not be replaced. Representatives from the Parish Council requested if it would be possible to reinstall two lights at their own expense as well as the running and maintenance cost; the reply was somewhat stark, yes but; was the reply. Unfortunately 'the but'; was that the Parish Council would have to pay for a new lighting survey and they would have to use the County Council's contractor to carry out this new lighting survey. If this new showed that the installation of our two reinstated lights disrupted the designed lighting pattern, then the Parish Council would have to pay, not only for the new lighting survey, but if the survey showed that the lighting pattern had been disrupted by the installation of the Parish lights, the Parish Council would have to pay for all the existing lights to be moved to conform to the County Council's lighting pattern. It was felt that this would incur high cost which the Parish Council could not justify. It was

felt by those at the meeting that the issue of Old Stratford Street lighting was, as far as the County Council Engineers were concerned it was a done deal. We have also got to obtain a license to temporarily install the Speed Indicator Devices that the Parish own.

Regarding the upgrade to the street lighting around the village; a full specification and business plan has now been completed and an application for funding has been submitted to claim money from our ring-fenced new homes bonus fund. This is money set aside for our village from new developments within our village, we should now see an upgrade shortly.

News in General:

The Blackhorse Field development is now moving at a pace and I believe that phase one is almost complete and phase two is now well on its way. I am not certain when the village will take over the allotments but at present the sites store area is still in the allotment allocated area. Once we are able to take them over the Parish Clerk will contact those who have expressed an interest in running or wishing to have an allotment plot.

The quarry at Passenham is still on going, the good news is that ham meadow has now been taken out of the mineral plan and at present is now no longer under threat.

I have to remind all residents; once again, regarding the need to be vigilant with regards to property burglaries and thefts from vehicle, most recent incidents have been thefts from vehicles or damage to vehicles. Any resident feeling that they have spotted something suspicious they should telephone the Police on 101 and/or our Neighbourhood watch Co-ordinator Mrs Jackie Ibell, telephone No: 01908 562677.

As stated in my autumn report the Parish Council were investigating the installation of planters around the village. Once again it is thanks to Councillor Carey and his tireless efforts to steer this project that we have now applied for grant funding to assist paying for these. I would also like to ask any local business who would like to sponsor one or more of these planters, their help would be much appreciated. All sponsors would be able to place their name on the planter advertising that they have contributed towards the planter.

Before I close my report I would just like to congratulate Mrs Gill Tee (MBE) on her retirement from our Primary School. Mrs Tee has worked for many years at the village school, the Parish Council and I hope she has an enjoyable retirement. Since my original report, we are also sad to learn that Mrs Tee's husband Cecil has unfortunately passed away after a long illness bravely borne. Cecil was once a long serving member of the Parish Council and at one time he was also a serving District Councillor. Our thoughts go with Gill and her family.

Highways issues

A reminder that **highway defects** such as pot holes, blocked drains and other highway defects can be reported to Street Doctor 0300 126 1000 (Option 4) or via the Northants County Council website (www.northamptonshire.gov.uk).

However, the best course of action is to contact the Parish Clerk Derek Everett on 01908 569053 or via the website www.oldstratford.org.uk who will do it for you and can keep tabs on repairs or works required on behalf of the Parish Council. This also applies to any **street lighting** defects.

Dog Fouling Continues to be a messy issue, especially on pavements and verges. The football field and areas around play areas are already designated 'poop-a-scoop' areas attracting heavier fixed penalty fines. As a former dog owner myself I would like to think that everyone picks up after their dog (even on public rights of way across fields) but, I'm not that naive. In Oxfield Park can we at least keep it off the mown edges to the paths because children play there. Falcon Drive open space is now becoming a serious issue again..

The Parish Council have dog bins installed and you can also use the Litter bins (normally with a bin liner so if double wrapped there should be no excuse)

Litter The thorny issue of litter around the shop and the route to Elizabeth Woodford School and other areas continues to attract adverse comments, even where we have installed new litter bins. With national campaigns to 'Keep Britain Tidy' a kindly word or thought could help, or show by example and make Old Stratford a more attractive place to live.

Please do not park on or opposite bus stops

Neighbourhood Watch Report

It looks like Summer is almost here so there are a few things I should remind you about, as most of us will be enjoying the Garden.

Sheds and Garages.

Sheds are easy targets. To secure the doors and windows invest in strong locks and key operated bolts. Garages Never leave a garage unlocked especially if it is connected to the house.

Garden

Store all ladders out of sight and lock all garden tools in the shed or garage. Don't make it easy for anybody to break in. Make sure your ladders are padlocked to a wall. Consider keeping hedged shrubbery below one metre high to maximise visibility from anyone Passing by. Installing PIR lights wherever there is access to doors and windows at the front and back of property is also a good idea.

Holidays

When a property is going to be empty for a night or more, speak to a trustworthy neighbour. Tell them how long you will be away and ask them to remove all mail from the letter box and if possible to park their car there for a few nights.
