Chairman's Update

Currently Old Stratford has one major planning application pending decision, which is known as Furtho Pit Warehousing. This proposed development continues to be very emotive and has seen many objections posted to West Northamptonshire Council Planning department.

Residents of Old Stratford should be assured that the Parish Council are continuing to monitor the reams of documents being put forward by the developer. To date the Parish Council has written three formal objections regarding the documentation submitted and we will continue to screen this paperwork to ensure that West Northants Council's Planning Department are continually reminded of their responsibilities to our community. Our objections to this application cover a wide range of issues, including size and scale of development, loss of biodiversity, highways and traffic issues and increased flood risk in the area and have highlighted to West Northants Council's Planners the many anomalies in the data presented by the applicant along with the flaws in the Consultants Assessments. We will continue to represent our community on this matter and work towards a positive outcome.

The other significant proposal in the Parish has been for housing at the Meadows. This application has been withdrawn following the objection posted by Milton Keynes Council highlighting flooding concerns, as the site is situated with in the flood-plain and must be assumed that it would have a negative effect on the development site of the old gasworks in Stony Stratford.

We have had a number of new Councillors co-opted to the Parish Council over the past few months. We would like to welcome them and thank them for their contributions to maintaining the services to our community. If anyone is interested in joining the Parish Council, please contact the clerk or keep an eye on our website/facebook site for upcoming vacances or elections.

The gates open at 5.30pm, with the display starting around 6.30pm for 15-20 minutes.

Please come earlier and support our groups with their muchneeded fundraising. Admission prices remain the same: FREE to anyone under 16 and only £2.50 for 16 and over.

We currently can <u>only</u> accept cash on the gate and at the various stalls/rides outside due



to wifi limitations, so but please bring cash with you on the evening (coins even better as we quickly run out!!).

Reporting Issues in the Parish

Residents wishing to report an issue with our roads or rights of way are encouraged to report via "fix my street" www.fixmystreet.com. The reports are forwarded directly to the relevant department for resolution.



They also have a handy app which can be downloaded on your phone and enables you to send a report with photos for many issues including abandoned vehicles, dog fouling, fly tipping, potholes, blocked drains and failed traffic lights. You will also receive updates on the actions being taken

Alternatively the Parish Clerk can assist with reporting, but please provide photographs if possible.

Bag that Poo - Any rubbish bin will do!

Dog fouling – loose or bagged – is offensive, disgusting and a potential health hazard. The Parish Council has received complaints from residents about dogs fouling the footpaths, children's play areas and the playing field at the Community Hall.

We know most dog owners are responsible and do clean up after their dogs, however there are many sites around the Parish where bagged poo is repeatedly left or thrown into hedgerows. If a dog waste bin is not available, then the bagged poo can be placed into any rubbish bin.

Towcester Area Door to Door (TADD)

This is an urgent appeal to the people of Old Stratford to consider becoming a volunteer driver – you need a car, a few free hours a week and a desire to help your neighbours. For more details about becoming a TADD volunteer driver visit our website or send us a message.

There are lots of elderly and mobility restricted people in Old Stratford who rely on TADD for door-to-door transport to their medical and wellbeing appointments. The service is crucial to their ability to remain independently at home in the village. We have only 3 drivers based in Old Stratford to serve 10 members. As a result, in July, we had to repeatedly ask drivers from as far away as Towcester and Silverstone to travel to Old Stratford to take members to their appointments. This cuts across our objective of using local volunteer drivers to minimise wasted mileage costs but also to provide a friendly face from the member's own community.

Neighbourhood Watch



At this time of the year as the evenings grow darker, it is easy for potential burglars to tell which homes are unoccupied, they just look to see which ones have lights on! A timer is a good idea. Link it to a hall light so that the light will show through several windows giving the impression more than one room is occupied.

Trick or Treat

Halloween is coming soon and is a fun time for the young ones but not everyone enjoys it! Playing pranks with flour and eggs can have serious consequences.

- 1. Please take young children out in organised groups.
- 2. Do not knock on doors that say No Trick or Treat
- 3. Be visible with torches and stay in well-lit areas.

4. Do not enter any houses always stay on the doorstep.

- 5. Finally please do not frighten the elderly or very young.
- 6. Be safe and enjoy yourselves.

A reminder about Christmas! Please do not leave any presents (wrapped or unwrapped) in view of any window or door, as this can be too much temptation for thieves.

Reporting Crime

If you are unlucky and have been a victim of crime you can report it in several ways:

- If it's an emergency and the crime is still taking place, call 999 and ask for the police.
- If it's not an emergency, do not call 999. This doesn't mean the crime is not important it just helps the police to make the best use of their resources. Northants Police use the 101 non-emergency number, so you can ring that number instead.
- If you have information regarding a crime and don't want to talk to the police, contact the charity Crimestoppers online or call 0800 555 111. You will remain 100% anonymous. Always.

Please note: Neighbourhood Watch does not take reports of crime.

Following a crime

- **Prevent others becoming a victim:** The quicker you act, the sooner you might stop someone else becoming a victim.
- Support for yourself: If you have been affected by crime and need confidential emotional support or advice on what to do next, you can contact Victim Support on 08 08 16 89 111.
